Instructions for Submitting an Abstract to the Human Anatomy & Physiology Society (HAPS) Annual Conference

Abstracts can be submitted to present in one of two formats:

- Poster Session Exhibition of scholarly activity that can encompass everything
 from data-driven work, dissection techniques to teaching activity descriptions.
 Examples could include quantitative or qualitative educational research, novel or
 emerging educational concepts, comparative studies from different educational
 levels, education outreach, assessment, evidence-based pedagogy, inclusive
 education, or other concepts.
- 2. Workshop Session Exhibition of pedagogical methods, teaching tips, techniques, strategies and demonstrations. Typically involves hands-on activities and/or interactive discussions. Example concepts include A&P education outreach, didactic concepts, assessment, emerging techniques, evidence-based pedagogy, and inclusive education, or other concepts.

Below are the requirements for abstracts (please see rubric for additional details):

- 1. Align with the mission of HAPS to promote excellence in the teaching of anatomy and physiology.
- 2. Include the title, author name(s), affiliation(s), and body.
- 3. Have a body of 100 words or less.
- 4. Do not include headings such as "Methods" or "Conclusions".
- 5. Do not contain graphs and/or figures.

Please be aware that if you mention the name of a product or entity, then your presentation is considered a sponsored presentation. Therefore, if you mention a product or entity, please read through this page for additional information: https://www.hapsweb.org/sponsored-presentations/. Alternatively, rewrite your abstract without mention of specific products, and refer to the products or entity more generically.

Once submitted, your abstract will be reviewed using the attached rubric. Please review the rubric before you submit your abstract.
