

Anatomy Lab Outreach Disclosure Form and Parental Consent Form

As an individual utilizing the anatomy labs at Rutgers New Jersey Medical School, it is important that you abide by all policies listed in this document and the laboratory, as well as any stated by a faculty member or the anatomy lab supervisor. While many of these rules are to protect you and others in the laboratory, they are also in place to ensure that the donors (i.e., those who gifted their body for your education) are always treated with the utmost respect, both in and outside the laboratory. Failure to adhere to these rules may result in your expulsion from the Anatomy lab and possible further disciplinary sanctions in the sole discretion of the University and/or the visiting institution.

What will the visit entail?

Please be advised that you or your child will be viewing a complete, dissected donor and some isolated organs. We ask that you please prepare for the tour by having a hearty meal before coming to the lab, as this will aid in preventing faintness during the tour. On rare occasions, some students may become lightheaded during the tour so we ask that you to review the symptoms that may indicate that a person is fainting. These include but are not limited to lightheadedness, dizziness, nausea, blurred vision, or feeling flushed. It is important to speak up immediately if you/they begin to experience any of these symptoms. If you/your student has a history of passing out, lightheadedness, dizziness, nausea, blurred vision, or feeling flushed, please check the box below:

Anatomy Laboratory Code of Conduct

Please note that "human anatomical materials" includes material from dissections and bones.

1. All visitors must conduct themselves in a professional manner at all times.
2. There is no food or drinks allowed in any of the anatomy labs at any time (including the small group discussion areas).
3. Proper attire must be worn, including long pants or floor length skirts, full coverage t-shirts (short or long sleeve), and closed-toed shoes.
4. Recording or photographing any of the human anatomical material is strictly prohibited.
5. Visitors will take proper care of all anatomical materials and treat them with respect at all times.
6. Visitors must not remove any anatomical materials from the anatomy laboratory.
7. The use of the Internet in general, and social media sites in particular, including, but not limited to, Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, etc., as a venue for discussing any aspect of the donor or donor dissection is strictly prohibited.
8. If any student is uncomfortable or does not wish to participate, the student should inform their teacher or the lab personnel immediately. Students are able to participate at their own comfort level.
